#### St Peter's Playtime Patroll

New playleaders have been introduced to Yoxall St Peter's Primary School to encourage a happy playtime.

Fifteen year five and six children have been selected by the class five teacher Mr Andrea.

The trainers (Hannah and Georgia from East Staffs Sports Partnership) came in on two mornings to train the fifteen children. Hannah and Georgia taught the children different skills they needed to have to be a Playleader. As a group they also discussed characteristics of a Playleader which included being friendly, reliable, reassuring and fum. They introduced skills on communication and taught different games to play with younger children, and even letthe year five and sizes make their own games. STEP was the key message to remember. This stands for Space Task Equipment People, which are things you need for each game.

All the Playleader training was arranged by the reception teacher, Miss Thacker.

This was organised because an issue had caught the teachers' eyes as many younger children had no one to play with as they were new to the school and trying to make some friends. Due to this issue Playleaders had been an idea to make a resolution to the problem.

This is what two of our Playleaders had to say about their experience.

Connie stated, "I wanted to be a Playleader to help the younger children, and this can help them by having someone to play with at playtimes."

Naomi expressed, "I think the younger children just sit around at lunch and they could be excited to go to lunch time and excited to play. I think it can help them by improving their learning behaviour in the classroom as they would have had a happier lunch leading to better behaviour in the classroom and it would give them something to do at lunch time instead of sitting on a bench."

The Playleaders were organised onto a rota with five children covering 3 days of the week, Monday, Wednesday, and Priday. The Playleaders set up the equipment, teach the children how to play, then encourage them to join in with the games such as:

- Domes and Dishes
- Please Mr Crocodile
- Hoop Mania the playleaders very own addition!

Carter from class I mentioned that his favourite game to play is snakes and ladders. Layla from class I stated that her favourite game to play is Hide and Seek. It has been a great success to get this started and it is hoped that the Playleaders will bring joy and happiness to the playground.
